Stated Code of Ethics to check malpractices and plagiarism in Research

Our Institute is committed to promoting and accountability in the conduct of academic research and is keen to embed and endorse a culture of honesty and transparency in all its institutional activities. In undertaking this commitment, the Institute emphasizes that academic freedom is a core value to be safeguarded and sustained. The Institute is dedicated to guaranteeing a free academic environment to conduct research, to teach, and to publish.

I. Code of the ethics by Research committee

- 1. To provide guidance and academic support to scholars on ethical issues in respect of teaching, research and other academic activities
- 2. On an entirely voluntary basis, researchers may ask the Committee for consultation on ethical aspects of their research.
- 3. The Committee is only convened at the explicit request of scholars needing an assessment of the ethical dimensions of a research project.
- 4. To act as an consultative body for any disputed matter concerning research ethics and conduct.

II. Research misconduct

Misconduct in academic research implies plagiarism in proposing, carrying out or reporting results of research It does not include honest error or honest differences in interpretation or judgment in evaluating research methods or results, or misconduct unrelated to research processes.

III. Plagiarism

The deliberate copying of ideas, text, data or other work (or any combination thereof) without due permission and acknowledgement.

IV. Piracy

The deliberate exploitation of ideas from others without proper Acknowledgement

V. Abuse of intellectual property rights

Failure to observe legal norms, regarding copyright and the moral rights of authors.

VI. Abuse of Research Resources

Failure to observe the terms and conditions of institutionally declared research resources.

VII. Defamation

Failure to observe relevant legal norms.

VIII. Misinterpretation

The deliberate attempt to represent falsely or unfairly the ideas or work of others,

IX. Personation

The situation where someone other than the person who has submitted any academic work has prepared (parts of) the work.
